Perform hand hygiene & don Personal Protective Equipment (PPE):

Head-to-toe coverage with water-impervious materials so NO SKIN, MUCOUS MEMBRANES OR HAIR IS EXPOSED.

- Make sure PPE training is up to date.
- Use extreme caution when removing PPE to avoid contamination of eyes, mucous membranes & clothing.
- Follow established decontamination procedures.
- Monitor exposure risk by communicating with receiving hospital.
